

#### **Brave Canadians at Vimy**



At the September 18 General Meeting, the branch was presented with a painted "Brave Canadians at Vimy" done by Associate member Blair Paul. In memory of his cousin, Lance Corporal Melville Paul, Canadain Infantry, 38th Battalion, who fought alongside his brave comrades at Vimy Ridge, April 9, 1917. Sadly. Melville was later killed in action on April 26, 1918, at age 23, near Arras, France and is buried at La Targette British Cemetery, Neuville-St. Vaast. The painting is hanging in Harmony Hall. Copies of a poster of the painting are available for sale, with 75% of the proceeds donated to Branch 314.
